#### **PROJECT NARRATIVE**

- 1) Project Description:
  - a) The project involves the renovation of Snug Harbor Park (Block 97, Lot 1), located at the Highlands Borough Community Center along Snug Harbor Avenue between Beach Boulevard and Bay Avenue. The park facilities sit between the community center building and Bay Avenue downtown area and are accessed by a parking lot at the southwest end along Bay Avenue, a driveway from Beach Boulevard to the northwest, and from a pedestrian bridge along Snug Harbor Avenue to the northeast. The existing park consists of a beach area, the community center building, small parking lot, modular skate park, basketball court, tennis court, play structure, bocce court, and shuffleboard court. The community center building is the location of Borough Council Meetings, land use board meetings, and various other committee meetings. The building was renovated after Hurricane Sandy, but the park features are deteriorated and in need of repair or replacement. The scope of this project includes renovation of the existing park elements in order to improve recreation quality and access between the community center, park, and central business district. No improvements to the community center building itself are proposed.
  - b) The project will be classified as a development project.
    - Proposed project elements include:
      - Reconstruction & realignment of parking lot
      - Access sidewalk
      - Reconstruction of basketball court
      - Reconstruction of tennis court
      - Reconstruction of skate park surface
      - Installation of park benches, picnic tables, and trash receptacles
      - Relocation of utility pole at entrance
    - The concept plan for the project site has been enclosed in Appendix A.
    - The project cost estimate is \$300,000 of which Highlands Borough is seeking financial assistance in the amount of \$150,000. The entire budget is considered eligible reimbursement costs. These eligible reimbursement costs are associated with the raw construction costs for the proposed improvements. A project cost estimate has been enclosed in Appendix A.
    - The community center property is owned by the Borough of Highlands.
    - Not applicable.
  - c) The Borough of Highlands is eager to complete the project as soon as funding permits. The administration period during which the project will be bid and awarded is estimated to take 2-3 months. A CAFRA permit from NJDEP will be required and is anticipated to take approximately 6 months. Construction is anticipated to take 4 months. The anticipated schedule is as follows:
    - Project Selection January 1, 2019
    - Execute Grant Agreement March 1, 2019
    - PA/SI Submission May 1, 2019

#### 2) Site Conditions and Natural Features:

- a) Snug Harbor Park is a municipal facility serving the 5,000 residents of Highlands Borough as well as the surrounding municipalities. It was originally developed in the 1970s and is located in the northeast section of the Borough at Sandy Hook Bay. It is bounded by Sandy Hook Bay to the north, Snug Harbor Avenue to the east, Bay Avenue to the south, and Central Avenue to the west. Immediately adjacent to the park features and within the property limits at the eastern edge is a 20' wide drainage canal that drains into Sandy Hook Bay. The canal is lined with bulkhead and separated from the park by a chain link fence. The western edge of the park abuts backyards of the residences fronting on Central Avenue. The property consists of approximately 2.25 acres and includes a beach at the north end, community center building in the northern portion, park features in the center, and parking lot at the south end. It is located in a CAFRA zone per NJDEP and is regulated as an AE Zone elevation 11 feet by FEMA. The land is generally fully developed and flat, approximately at elevation 5 feet. No wetlands are mapped on the property, and no additional environmental hazards are known.
- b) The property is located in the R-2.03 single family residential zone and has roadway frontage along Bay Avenue, approximately 250' north of the area of county jurisdiction as Monmouth County Route 8. Bay Avenue in Highlands Borough is a popular downtown area, with streetscape improvements and high walkability. Surrounding land uses are residential to the east and west, and commercial to the south. Opposite the site entrance to the south are Huddy Park and VFW Post #6902. The property currently exists as a public park that will be improved, enhancing the value to the surrounding residential uses. Improvements are compatible and enhance the surrounding land uses by supporting the recreational facilities in this portion of the park. A utility pole at the southern entrance will be relocated and the parking lot realigned in order to provide better circulation and increased parking for the park and community center. The improvements proposed conform to open space & recreation goals of Borough Master Plan. The plan stresses providing varied recreation opportunities in order to serve the needs of a variety of individuals. The park improvements accomplish this by improving several different features that would generally appeal to different age and interest groups. The Plan also states "quality and quantity of recreational opportunities available to a community has a direct effect on the community's general quality of life." This project addresses both quantity and quality for recreation opportunities. The location of this park has the added benefit of being the site of Borough Council meetings, making the improvements

and opportunities conspicuous to attendees. In addition, the park is in close proximity to the central business district along Bay Avenue and provides access between this downtown area and the community center building. No natural, cultural, or historic features of the site will be negatively affected by the development.

#### 3) Recreation/Open Space Program

- a) The specific goal of this project is to improve the existing recreational complex located within Highlands Borough. We feel this clearly meets the goals of the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Grant Program to "improve land for parks and recreation purposes." The development of and improvement to municipal open space and recreational facilities has been a consistent primary goal of the Highlands Borough Master Plan Conservation and Community Facilities Element through adaptation and reexamination. The renovation of the basketball and tennis courts, as well as the skate park surface, will enhance the use of this facility for recreational purposes and encourage use of the adjacent park, beach, and community center in this heavily trafficked portion of the Borough. The improvements to Snug Harbor have been a long term priority for the Borough of Highlands.
- b) Residents of the Borough are accepted in the many public and private programs and events which are held at the facility. The groups that use the existing park and will significantly benefit from the proposed improvements include, but are not limited to:
  - "Kids on the Move" After School Drop-In Recreation Program
  - "Summer Kidfest" Summer Recreation Program
  - Teen Nights sponsored by Municipal Alliance & Recreation Dept.
  - Summer Basketball Camp
  - Miscellaneous special events such as Halloween Costume Contest

#### PROJECT NARRATIVE

An inventory of existing open space has been enclosed in Appendix E. Highlands Borough has recently renovated Veteran's Park and the Community Center Building as part of an ongoing effort to improve recreation facilities. The Borough recognizes the value of this program and its potential to create and improve recreation and open space opportunities for its residents. Highlands has been successful in applying for and obtaining grants through this program in an effort to improve various parks and recreation facilities in the Borough.

- c) Highlands Borough is a small, but densely populated municipality and maintains a limited number of public parks, so each one is valued. Only Snug Harbor Park and Veteran's Park offer public basketball courts, and the tennis court at Snug Harbor Park is the only one available to the public in the Borough. Improving these facilities at Snug Harbor remains a priority for the Borough in order to provide access to these popular recreational activities. This project also provides greater access to the community center via increased parking and improved pedestrian walkways, and aims to increase community involvement and participation. This project was chosen over several other possible projects due to these reasons and in accordance with the Borough Master Plan's stated goals for open space and recreation, specifically, "Provide adequate park, open space, and recreational facilities for all Borough residents". The existing courts are in poor condition, and it is anticipated that proper courts will significantly increase interest and usage. An excerpt from the 2016 Master Plan Reexamination is enclosed in Appendix E affirming the recreation and open space goals.
- d) Snug Harbor Park is a key component of the recreation system of Highlands Borough as the only place in the northwest of the Borough with a dedicated basketball court and the only location in the Borough with dedicated a tennis court. Please see the attached community facilities map located in Appendix B showing nearby recreation and open space areas.
- e) This project is consistent with State, County and local plans to increase and improve recreational facilities within the State of New Jersey. An excerpt from the Borough Master Plan affirming the goal of providing and maintaining park and recreation facilities has been enclosed with the Application (Appendix E).







#### <u>Public Hearing held at Borough Council Meeting for FY 2018 Monmouth County Municipal Open Space</u> <u>Grant Program Application</u>

Borough Clerk Bonnie Brookes opening the public hearing for the Monmouth County Open Space application. Drew Pavlick (CME Associates) introduced the grant program and discussed the project selection process. The proposed project was described as improving the public park at Snug Harbor including resurfacing the parking lot, basketball court, and tennis court, and possibly adding a splash park and cast-in-place skate park.

- Kim Gonzales, the Borough Administrator, or her successor is authorized to (a) make an application to the County of Monmouth for Open Space Trust Funds, (b) provide additional application information and furnish such documents as may be required for the Municipal Open Space Grants Program and (c) act as the municipal contact person and correspondent of the above named municipality; and
- 2. The Borough of Highlands is committed to this project and will provide the balance of funding necessary to complete the project as described in the grant application in the form of non-county matching funds as required in the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Program; and
- 3. If the County of Monmouth determines that the application is complete and in conformance with the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Program and the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Municipal Grants Program adopted thereto, the municipality is willing to use the approved Open Space Trust Funds in accordance with such policies and procedures, and applicable federal, state, and local government rules, regulations and statutes thereto; and
