

## PK-12 Regionalization Final Survey Results– Report Nov 15<sup>th</sup> 2021

**Background and Objectives:** This survey was designed to help better understand feelings towards possible regionalization of the school districts. Atlantic Highlands Elementary, Highlands Elementary and Henry Hudson Regional are each separate Districts with a combined enrollment of approximately 800 students. Each school has its own Board of Education. Atlantic Highlands has 9 members, Highlands has 7 members and Henry Hudson Regional has 9 members for a total of 25 board members. There is one shared Superintendent of Schools, and two Business Administrators. Regionalization would combine all three schools into one K-12 district with one Board of Education which is the norm in K-12 towns throughout NJ and beyond.

Using the survey results, the goal is to aid the Governing Bodies and Boards of Education of Atlantic Highlands, Highlands and Sea Bright understanding the Stakeholders' input from all three towns.

**Data Collection:** All respondents were a combination of residents and property owners of the three towns. The survey consisted of 12 questions. Logistically, the survey was created for both online and paper survey completion. The survey's duration was an average of 7 minutes, and the completion rate was 72%. The survey was promoted on the Boroughs' and Boards of Education websites. In Highlands, the survey was shared to the following Social Media accounts: Facebook, Instagram and Twitter. Also, in Highlands, a postcard campaign was sent via Every Door Direct Mail. All channels were used to encourage a good response. Study period was September 21, 2021, through October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021.

**Demographics & Statistics:** According to the 2020 US Census, the populations of the towns are as follows: Atlantic Highlands 4,429, Highlands is 4,621 and Sea Bright is 1449. Tabulations used a **90%** confidence level and accepted a margin of error of **±4**. This means the proportion was tested to assess whether a sample from a population represents the true proportion from the entire population. Using this test, we are **90% confident** that the data reflects the true populations using a margin of error of **±4**.

**Action Standard:** This research will be used to provide the Borough Councils and the Boards of Education with data that reflects what Stakeholders in each town's thoughts and ideas are regarding Regionalization.

**Conclusions and Recommendations:** **518** [Atlantic Highlands 93, Highlands 338, Sea Bright 78] respondents answered Q1-Q11 and **200** answered the optional open ended Q12. When looking at the data tables, the yellow highlight with a letter means that response is significantly higher or lower than the column referenced.

The biggest takeaways from this survey are as follows:

- Overall, **73%** of those surveyed want to regionalize the school districts broken down as follows: Atlantic Highlands [**59%**] Highlands [ **76%**] and Sea Bright [**72%**].
- The top answer to the benefits to regionalization was Lower taxes [**45%**]. The lowest was I do not feel there is any benefit to regionalization [**7%**]
- The top answer to the barriers to regionalization was I do not feel there is any barrier to regionalization [**52%**]. The lowest answer was Fear of how special needs students would be handled [**6%**]
- The top answer to possible regionalization outside of the original proposed was Atlantic highlands and Highlands [**52**] This is more than twice the percent of the next answer Highlands and Sea Bright [**22%**]
- Of the **154** respondents who have kids PK-12 in schools, **206** children attend Public School and **44** attend Private School. Breakdowns are as follows Total/Public/Private: Atlantic Highlands [**55/80/15**] Highlands [ **79/98/23**] and Sea Bright [**20/28/6**].

I'd like to see the data from Oceanport Schools & Shore Regional with Sea Bright students pulled out as a co-hort. If the ideal number from the state is 3K, isn't the proposed merger a waste of time? We won't even be at 1K. Who's doing and funding ALL of the work? Since you disregard the BOE decision, why assume they'd do the work. Why are the boroughs pursuing this when BOE's were explicitly told they would not pursue if any one entity opposed? 3 entities opposed. Why not come together with BOE's to make best decisions for all. This is being forced / pushed by certain people...and very politically motivated. This is not in best interests of all involved.
