


Battle of Navesink, Highlands NJ

Esek Hartshorne's home on the hill above Highlands along what is now Navesink Avenue between Rogers and Waddell Streets was fortified and used by the local Patriot militia as a base for their operations in our area. Esek was a supporter of the Militia and his home overlooking Sandy Hook was perfect to watch British movements on the nearby waters. On February 13, 1777, a force of about 200 British soldiers crossed the Bay from Staten Island and attacked the sleeping Americans. In the surprise attack at least three Americans were killed, 71 were captured and taken as prisoners to New York. The rest escaped into the woods. This was the only land battle that took place in Highlands during the Revolution.

The British capital of the American Colonies was New York City. All the supplies for their soldiers were made in England, had to be brought to North America by sailing ships, and all of these ships had to sail past the tip of Sandy Hook to reach New York. Making sure that their ships reached New York safely was critical to their armies.

Joshua Huddy Abduction and Hanging

Joshua Huddy was a Captain in the New Jersey militia in Monmouth County. He led forces in numerous battles from Toms River north to the Highlands area. In 1782, he was captured by Loyalist forces in Rumson and taken to New York City to the notorious British Sugar House prison. In April, he was abducted from the prison by Loyalists from Monmouth County who accused him of killing their relatives. He was carried off to the beach in Water Witch, Highlands and hung. This cold-blooded murder created a furor involving George Washington and the Kings of France and England and nearly de-railed the negotiations ending the American Revolution which were finally completed successfully. A monument to Joshua Huddy's sacrifice stands in Huddy Park, Highlands just yards from where he was murdered.

Crowd Digging on Beach During Highlands Gold Rush

In May 1948 two Highlands clammers returning from a long workday on the water, stepped from their rowboat onto the beach at Cedar Street. Looking down, William and Lloyd Cottrell saw the glint of gold at the water's edge. Dropping to their knees, they sifted through the sand and found several dozen more gold coins. Despite their efforts to keep their finds a secret, word got out and the next day the beaches in Highlands were covered by hundreds of people with shovels digging for their chance at treasure. Unfortunately, by days later no more coins had been found. The coins turned out to be Portugese gold pieces from the mid 1700's, possibly dropped by Army payroll officers during the British crossing of the river after the Battle of Monmouth.



The British built forts on the Hook, operated the Sandy Hook Lighthouse to guide their ships, and allowed hundreds of Loyalists to take refuge from the local Patriots on the Hook. While most of Monmouth County and New Jersey was controlled by American patriots, Sandy Hook was an important British outpost in New Jersey.

British Evacuation After Battle of Monmouth

After the Battle of Monmouth in Freehold, over 12,000 British troops marched to the hills above Highlands where they waited to board ships to take them to New York. George Washington's Army was behind them but he had decided not to attack again. In July 1778, the British camped on the hills and built pontoon bridges so they could reach their vessels. They boarded the ships without further combat and sailed to New York.

Sandy Hook Lighthouse Attacked By Patriots

The Sandy Hook Lighthouse built in 1761 was important to guiding arriving ships safely into New York Harbor. During the Revolution, the British fortified the area around the Lighthouse and guarded it with Army and Loyalist soldiers. George Washington ordered the destruction of the lighthouse and a Patriot raiding party removed its lamps and oil. Later Lt Colonel Benjamin Tupper's troops fired their cannon at the tower but its thick walls protected it from militia guns.

Brush will be picked up by zone during the months of April, October, and December on Fridays.

*****Zone 4 will have an additional brush pick in the month of June. *****

By ordinance, brush placement is only allowed during the first 5 days prior to collection. Place all brush 10 feet from storm drains, inlets or streams. All brush must be 25 feet from an intersection. Please remove vehicles from street during brush removal Fridays, by zone, as the street sweeper will follow the brush pick up – as per Borough Code 3-7.4.

*****Leaves will be picked up in October, November & December.*****

Bulk will be picked up by zone during the months of March, June, September, and December on Fridays. As per Borough Code 3-7.4.

There is NO residential recycling on the fifth Wednesday of any given month.

No trash pickup during scheduled holidays – Thanksgiving, Christmas, & New Year's Day

Residents may also bring metals, recyclables, electronics, brush and leaves to the Recycling Center (must be separated).

Construction debris and Styrofoam are NOT accepted!

Fuel must be removed from landscaping and other equipment.

The Division of Code Enforcement provides regular inspections throughout the borough to ensure compliance with borough ordinances and building codes. Typically, the official will look for property maintenance violations and properties in an unsafe condition or state of disrepair. The Code Official can respond to complaints and inquiries from residents about conditions that may not conform to ordinance standards. Year-round and seasonal housing is inspected to ensure safe and habitable conditions exist in dwellings that are rented rather than owner-occupied. The Code Enforcement Official is there to protect all residents and businesses from unsafe and unsightly conditions to make the borough a better place to live.

“Spike Wrecks” Ships Burned by Patriots in Sandy Hook Bay Whaleboat Wars

British supply ships arriving off Sandy Hook after their trans-Atlantic voyages anchored in Sandy Hook Bay awaiting favorable tides and winds to pass through the Narrows and into New York Harbor. While anchored at night with small crews to guard them, they often fell prey to Patriot crews who silently rowed out to them in the dark, overcame the guards, and loaded their valuable cargoes of weapons, gunpowder, ships sails and rope, and other supplies into their 30 foot-long open whaleboats. The ships were then set on fire. Local divers have located these wrecks and named them the “Spike Wrecks” due to the large numbers of spikes found in the burned timbers. Come up to see them in the Highlands Museum at Twin Lights.

Local Loyalists who supported and fought for the British made Sandy Hook their refuge and base for raids on Patriot farms, homes and businesses in the area in search of supplies to send to the English in New York City. These men were given the name “Refugees” and were commanded by a former slave named Commander Tye. They terrorized the area throughout the War even after Colonel Tye was killed by local Patriot militia.

6 Pounder Cannon Ball Found In Highlands

As a child over fifty years ago, Danny Campbell was digging in his grandmother's back yard at 21 Fifth Street. He came upon a heavy iron ball in the sand. He was fascinated by it. His parents said he could keep it and years later he brought it to the Historical Society of Highlands where Revolutionary War experts identified it as a cannon ball fired by a British "6 Pounder" artillery piece during the war.

Halliburton Monument, Sandy Hook NJ

On December 31, 1783, the Revolutionary War was over and the British were leaving their headquarters in New York City to return to England. A small group of British seamen decided they didn't want to go home and they escaped to Sandy Hook. A party of 13 British Navy sailors from the HMS Assistance was ordered to capture them but they were lost in a blizzard on the Hook and froze to death. Their deaths are honored by the 1937 stone memorial and flags on Sandy Hook. Their remains were moved to Cypress Hills Cemetery in New York City in the early 1900's.
